



One of the finest benefits offered by the Educational and Cultural Trust Fund of the Electrical Industry is Camp Integrity. In 1971 our Trustees, recognizing the important contribution a camp can make in the growth and development of your children, built Camp Integrity on the shores of Southampton, Long Island. This year we are pleased to offer Camp Integrity at our new location in Burlingham, N.Y., near Middletown, New York.

Since that first summer in 1972, over 19,052 children have enjoyed an educational program, while experiencing the spirit of adventure in surroundings that are maintained with safety in mind. Learning new skills, developing leadership, gaining a greater sense of responsibility and improving their self images are some of the goals of the Camp Integrity Staff.

While the children may at first find themselves surrounded by strangers, they also find that in camp life many of the campers quickly become life-long friends. The fact that all worthwhile relationships are based on faith and mutual respect assists the child to quickly become accustomed to the new surroundings.

The Officers of Local Union No. 3, I.B.E.W. and the Trustees of the Educational and Cultural Trust Fund of the Electrical Industry maintain a high level of interest and supervision in the program and the facilities of the camp. Improvements are constantly being implemented.

PROGRAMS

Camp Integrity programs have been developed so that they will benefit each child in both mental and physical growth while at camp. Your child will participate in such activities as softball, soccer, volleyball, lacrosse, archery, swimming, rowing, canoeing, cooking, first aid, games, skits, handcrafts and nature walks. Each activity aids in the development of important skills and concepts, such as: coordination, concentration, creativity, team effort; and enhances the qualities of self-confidence and self-discipline.

The aquatics program helps our campers develop their capabilities and self-assurance in the water. Swimming instructions and games, as well as recreational swimming activities are held at the camp.

During the swim periods, our instructional staff will focus on teaching the proper swimming strokes and the drown-proof float. At our boating area on the lake, row boating and canoeing instructions are enjoyed by the campers while they develop their waterfront skills.

Arts, crafts and drama enable campers to develop talents they may not be aware they possess. Our campers have shown in the past they can, with guidance, greatly expand their ingenuity and, with patience and motivation, increase their creative talents. At Camp Integrity, we want our campers to appreciate the outdoors. We try to provide them with enough knowledge and confidence to take

care of themselves in the woods. It is equally important that they learn that nature exists in a delicate balance and that we can, by a careless action, destroy the environment.

STAFF

Throughout the years most of our staff have been the sons and daughters of members of the industry. Counselors are selected to join the staff because of their sincere interest in working with young people and by their prior experience in the various program areas. The staff has all the necessary certifications required by the state Public Health Regulations and must successfully complete the pre-camp training course.

We continue to be very proud of our camp staff for their dedication to the principles of Camp Integrity. There has been and will always be a total concern that each camper receives the full benefit of camp life and the importance of the individual is neither neglected or underestimated.

CAMPER ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility is based on one parent being a participant in the Educational and Cultural Trust Fund of the Electrical Industry. The child must be at least eight years of age when he or she arrives at camp, and not have reached their 16th birthday by the end of the camp session. There are separate sessions for boys and girls

RESERVATIONS

If you are interested in having your children take part in this Educational and Cultural Trust Fund activity, complete the enclosed application as directed and send it with your check or money order for two hundred and forty (\$240.00) dollars, made payable to Camp Integrity, to cover the camp registration fee for a thirteen-day session for each child. This fee only represents a small portion of the total cost of the operation of Camp Integrity. MEALS

The camp has a modern kitchen which provides a healthy, balanced appetizing menu that meets all the needs of very active children.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Each year the camp passes several inspections by the Health Department. Every effort is made to provide a healthy and safe surrounding. As a mutual precaution, each camper will have had a medical examination and medical history taken prior to arrival at camp. This must be sent to Camp Integrity at least 10 days before the campers arrival.

PERSONAL GEAR

The camp provides a bunk, mattress and foot locker, for use at camp. Parents must provide personal clothing, blankets, pillows and pillow cases, sheets and a combination lock for the foot locker. Each article of clothing and belongings must have the campers name marked on it, so

items can be returned. Electronic equipment, radios, CD players and expensive clothing are not items to bring to camp. A list of clothing and other items needed for camp will be mailed with the camp confirmation.

Departures are on SATURDAY. Breakfast and camp chores keep the campers busy until 10:00 a.m. when the camper sign out begins. The camper must leave camp prior to 12 noon so that the camp can be prepared for the incoming campers. Due to this schedule, there is no provision for campers to stay after 12 noon.

RAILROAD

If you call the camp and tell us the time of arrival, the camp vehicle will meet you and your child at the train station. If transportation is a problem, please call the camp, perhaps we will be able to assist. We would not want a child to miss camp due to a lack of transportation.
