It Is Never Too Late to Obtain A High School Diploma

For over 50 years Local Union No. 3 has recognized the importance of a high school education and a high school diploma.

To assist Local Union No. 3 members and their families to study for and take the G.E.D. exam, the Educational and Cultural Trust Fund sponsors preparation classes at the Electric Industry Center. A licensed professional teacher conducts the classes on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 5 – 7 P.M.

Two recent studies have shown that there is evidence that employers may use the GED as a signal of productive attributes in a pool of dropouts, choosing to hire GED holders over dropouts who never obtain their GED diplomas. The central finding of this study is that the earnings of GED candidates who successfully obtain a GED grow faster in the years after the GED attempt than did the earnings of unsuccessful candidates. The results indicate that successful candidates are expected to earn from 13% to 20% more than comparable GED candidates who do not obtain their diploma. – Excerpt from article
