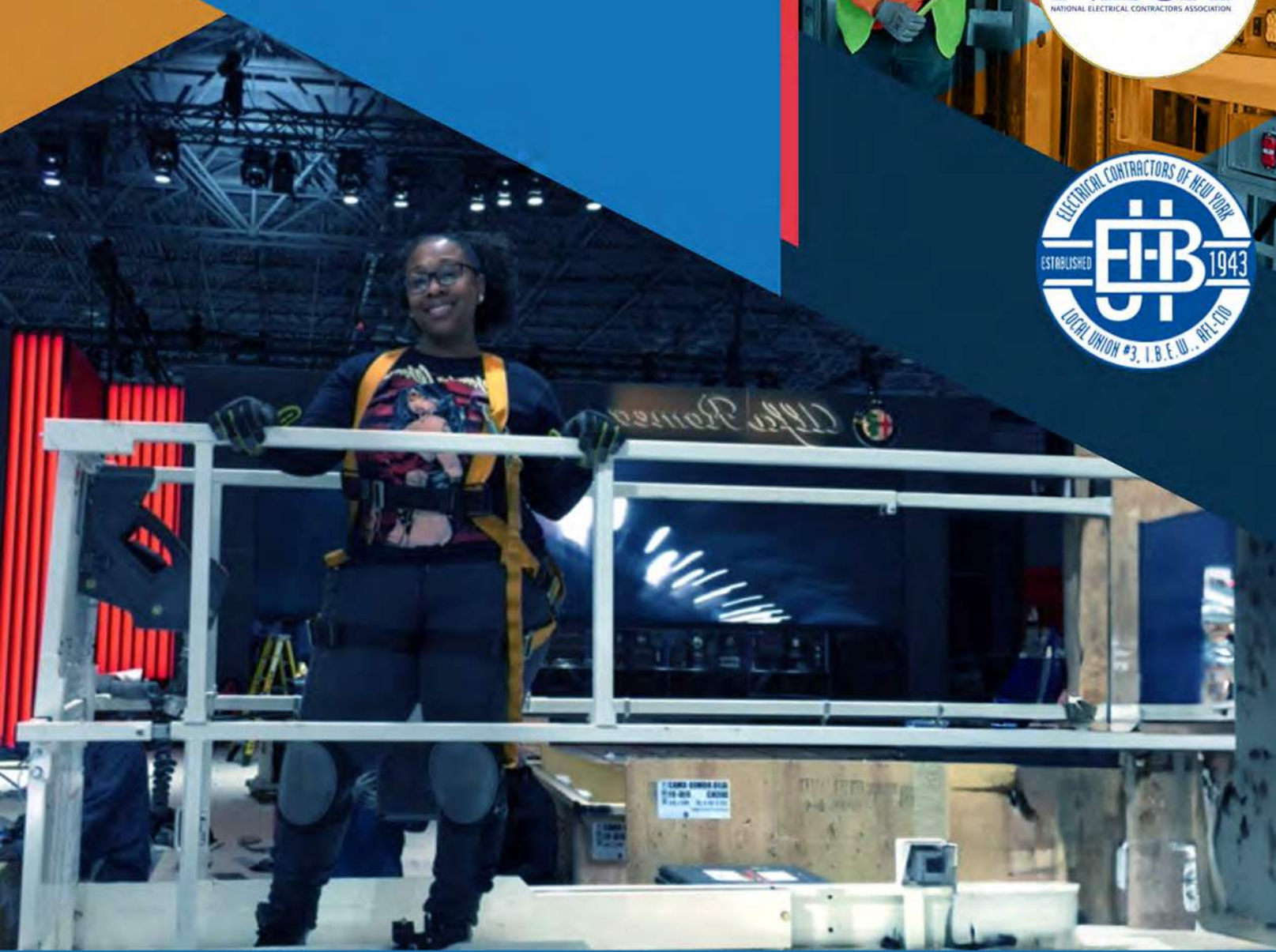

A SUCCESSFUL HISTORY OF LABOR-MANAGEMENT PARTNERSHIP



Since 1943, when representatives from the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local Union No. 3 and electrical contractors in New York City created the Joint Industry Board of the Electrical Industry (JIB), the emphasis has always been on labor-management cooperation.



THEIR GOAL remains to utilize all resources to their fullest capacity in order to promote harmony among employers and employees. These resources include progressive management, benefits administration, education, and training. By working together, IBEW Local Union No. 3 and contractors affiliated with the National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA) and the Association of Electrical Contractors (AEC) have greatly improved the lives of electrical workers and their families. Through these joint efforts, the JIB has established apprenticeship training, journey person education, contractor support, and construction

safety programs. This unique partnership translates into safe, cost-efficient projects in the full scope of electrical construction and maintenance.

INDUSTRY BENEFITS AND ADVANTAGES

Cooperation and professionalism are qualities that are forever embedded in the culture of the Joint Industry Board of the Electrical Industry.

Contractors, manufacturers, and supply companies enter into a world of progressive labor relations and professional benefits administration. This includes support on insurance issues, business conditions, and legislative concerns. In addition, the JIB has developed an open forum for a dialogue between employer and employee representatives on a regular basis.

The employee participants in the benefit plans receive comprehensive medical coverage for themselves and their immediate family members.

Pension and Annuity plans allow each worker to retire with dignity after a lifetime of employment. Employees, just like their employers, have representation on all jointly managed plans, giving workers a collective voice in guiding industry policies.

Throughout its history, the JIB has provided all of its members with job and employee search assistance.

A jointly administered employment referral system has been in place for over 60 years. This method streamlines the hiring process by matching the available workforce with the needs of current employers. This lowers hiring costs and reduces the time often required for employees to identify job opportunities.
